

Movement pattern

- 34 countries move equids to
- 15 Southern African countries from
- 6 different continents
- 69 different trade directions
- 7050 equids moved [0101] HS code]
- Continent source diversity
 - Europe: 13 countries
 - Africa: 11 countries

Source of Equines

- 75% of equids move from South Africa
- Namibia (7%), Zimbabwe (4%) and Australia (3%) make up majority of the
- 88% of equids moved to Southern Africa originate in Africa
- 12% of equids originate from outside of Africa: 70% of which are destined for South Africa; 15% are destined to Tanzania, Seychelles and Mozambique none of which have sent equines to South Africa in 2015/16

African movements

- Most bi-directional movements between countries are:
 - South Africa ↔ Namibia with 19% of total movements. In this partnership RSA is the origin of 66% of equids.
 - South Africa ↔ Botswana with 34% of total movements. RSA is the origin of 99% of equids, so a relatively one sided relationship
